California has weaponized its workforce

PAGA: Private Attorneys General Act

What Is It?

PAGA allows any employee to sue his or her employer on behalf of the state of California for alleged labor code violations. These lawsuits bypass normal class-action safeguards, making it one of the easiest lawsuits an attorney can file.

Where Did This Come From?

In 2004, California lawmakers claimed the state lacked resources to enforce labor laws. Instead of hiring investigators, they outsourced enforcement to trial attorneys and employees. Overnight, every worker became a 'deputized attorney general.'

Who Is It Benefiting?

- The state of California takes 65% of every settlement.
- Plaintiff attorneys walk away with hundreds of thousands in fees.
- Employees themselves average only \$1,264 each, including those with million-dollar settlements.

This system enriches lawyers and the state — not workers.

How Easy Is It To Get Fined?

- Employees working for more than 5 hours must start a meal break before the 5th hour ends.
- If lunch starts at 1:05 PM instead of 1:00 PM, it's a violation, even if a full lunch is taken.
- Employers owe an extra hour of wages each time this occurs.
- With 50–100 employees, fines multiply into the hundreds of thousands quickly.

Common 'Gotcha' Violations:

- · Late or missed meal/rest breaks
- · Inaccurate or incomplete pay stubs
- · Minor payroll clerical errors
- · Misclassifying contractors vs. employees
- · Unpaid or miscalculated overtime

Example

100 X 100 LATE X \$100 = IN FINES/
EMPLOYEES X LUNCHES X PENALTY = MONTH

With attorney fees, settlements often exceed \$500,000-\$1,000,000.

What Has It Cost Businesses?

- · Over \$10 billion in PAGA settlements since 2013.
- · Average settlement: \$1.1 million.
- Average attorney payout: \$372,000 per case.



Examples of Mid-Sized Companies (50–100 Employees):

- A family-owned restaurant group (~80 employees) paid \$750,000 for repeated meal-break timing errors, forcing them to sell locations.
- A Riverside manufacturer (60 employees) faced a \$1.2 million PAGA lawsuit over clerical payroll errors and closed after 25 years.
- A medical staffing agency (~100 employees) paid \$900,000 for 'off-the-clock' claims and payroll slip-ups, then moved operations out of California.

Why It's Unsustainable

- Employers cannot operate perfectly 100% of the time.
- Small technical mistakes are turned into sixand seven-figure lawsuits.
- Thousands of businesses have been forced to settle or shut down.
- California has created a hostile, unpredictable climate where business is punished — not supported.

The Bottom Line:

In California, a late lunch or a typo on a pay stub can bankrupt a business. This isn't justice — it's extortion disguised as labor law.

Business Courts & Pro-Growth Incentives

What Is It?

Oklahoma has established specialized Business Courts and streamlined permitting systems to ensure fair, efficient, and predictable outcomes for companies. Instead of setting traps for employers, Oklahoma's legal and regulatory framework is designed to help businesses grow, expand, and create jobs.

Where Did This Come From?

In 2025, Oklahoma leaders recognized that outdated court structures slowed down economic growth. They took action, creating dedicated Business Courts and pairing them with statewide pro-business policies:

- Right-to-Work laws protecting employer flexibility.
- · Quality Jobs Act incentives rewarding job creation.
- Local tax and permitting reforms designed to attract new investment.

Who Is It Benefiting?

- Employers gain predictability and protection from frivolous lawsuits.
- Employees benefit from stable jobs and new opportunities created by growing companies.
- Communities prosper with new tax revenue, stronger infrastructure, and long-term business anchors.

Unlike California, Oklahoma's system is not designed to enrich lawyers or the state at the business' expense — it's designed to lift the entire community.

- Lower taxes property tax rate just 4.75%, compared to California's 13.3%.
- Workers' compensation costs are among the lowest in the nation.

What Has It Meant for Businesses?

- Oklahoma projects often cost half as much to build and operate compared to California.
- Major infrastructure is already underway including a new data center and a power plant — signaling long-term growth and investment stability.
- Employers spend less time in courtrooms and more time innovating, expanding, and hiring.

- Predictable courts, stable policies, and pro-business leadership create long-term confidence.
- Businesses aren't punished for clerical mistakes — they are protected, supported, and encouraged to succeed.
- Companies relocating or expanding here find certainty, savings, and community support.

Regular Quality Jobs Incentive (a Ten Year Program) \$241,843

The Oklahoma Quality Jobs Program (QJP) provides a cash rebate of up to 5% of quarterly payroll for up to 10 years, for qualifying companies that create new jobs. The company must meet an average wage of \$42,889, achieve a \$2.5 million annual payroll within 3 years (in 4 consecutive quarters), and offer basic health insurance.

New Jobs Tax Credit (a Five Year Program)

The Investment/New Jobs Tax Credits provide manufacturers with a tax credit of the greater of 1% of investment in new depreciable property or \$500 per new employee. Minimum investment is \$50,000. The credit doubles in an enterprise Zone or if the investment exceeds \$40 million. The incentive program is a five-year program and unused credits may be carried forward.
